Dr. Greene will present the Collaborative & Proactive Solutions model:

- Solve problems rather than modifying behavior
- Emphasis on collaborative rather than unilateral solutions
- Encourage proactive rather than reactive intervention
- De-emphasis on diagnostic categories
- Learn about practical, research-based tools for assessment and intervention

Ross W. Greene, Ph.D. is the originator of the model of intervention now known as **Collaborative & Proactive Solutions** (CPS) and author of the influential books *The Explosive Child* and *Lost at School*. He is also the Founding Director of the non-profit *Lives in the Balance* (www.livesinthebalance.org), which aims to disseminate his model through no-cost web-based programming and provide support to and advocacy on behalf of behaviorally challenging kids and their parents teachers, and other caregivers. Dr. Greene served on the faculty at Harvard Medical School for over 20 years, and is now on the faculty of the Department of Psychology at Virginia Tech. He consults extensively to families, general and special education schools, inpatient psychiatry units, and residential and juvenile detention facilities, and lectures widely throughout the world.
